In 2003, after completing my doctoral studies, I accepted a request to establish the School of Social Work at Sapir College. For five years, I had a joint appointment at Sapir College and Ben-Gurion University. In 2009, after my sabbatical in the United States, I saw the need to invest more in positioning the Social Work School at Sapir College at a time when the region has been subject to continuous missile attacks, and I dedicated myself to this challenge. On the one hand, there is no doubt that it was an enriching educational experience for me. On the other hand, my position demanded many hours of work in the community and at the College, far beyond the time and effort that most scholars invest in teaching and research. In September 2013, I completed a decade as Head of the Social Work School, and spent a sabbatical at Boston College until the end of the 2013/14 academic year. In October 2014, I returned to Sapir College as a faculty member of the School of Social Work and as the PI of the TachyWe EU project at the School. During 2016-2018 academic years, I have devoted time to advancing new professional knowledge about the global migration crisis as part of the EASSW project grant. At 2018, I was invited to spend a visiting period at the University of Trento, Department of Psychology and Cognitive Science (Rovereto, Italy) to hold a course on Trauma and Post-traumatic Stress Disorder Treatments. Recently, I was nominated by the Israeli coordinator at the Ministry of Science & Technology, to represent Israel as a member committee in COST (European Cooperation in Science & Technology) CA18115 title: *Transnational Collaboration on Bullying, Migration and Integration at School Level*. Last April, I was nominated as a visiting researcher at the Department of Neurobiology, Weizmann Institute, Israel.

In addition, I have continued to invest efforts in promoting the profession and giving a voice to public needs, including the communities surrounding Sapir College. In 2014, I received the prestigious “Katan Prize” for my contribution to the needs of individuals and communities as a social worker and academic lecturer. In 2016, I received a prestigious award of distinction from the Israeli Parliament for my groundbreaking efforts to integrate academic scholarship and work with needy communities.
